through the witness offered by the lives of believers: by their very existence in the world, Christians are called to radiate the word of truth that the Lord Jesus has left us” (Benedict XVI, *Porta Fidei*, 6). When we hear the word “conversion,” we spontaneously think that it concerns changing bad habits and incorrect behavior, but it is necessary to change our way of thinking before we can change our way of acting. Today we have a problem seeing things clearly. We frequently justify our behavior, saying, “What’s wrong about it? Everyone’s doing it!” How can we change our way of thinking? How can we be renewed? A true change of mentality involves recognizing as valid and trustworthy a truth that perfects and completes the certitudes on which we base our life. Only a truth that is not imposed but that is lovingly offered will be welcomed as a new way of thinking that can prompt us to adopt a new style of life.

Christ presents himself as the Truth who proposes life and, once this proposal is accepted, lovingly and patiently waits for it to bear fruit (cf. Lk. 13:6-9). His attitude underscores that changing our way of thinking does not yield instant results; it is a gradual process in which docility and perseverance play key roles. It is a basic attitude that springs from a love that we accept, correspond to, and nourish every day through listening and adoration. Are we ready to be converted? Are we ready to change our way of thinking?

Give us the joy of experiencing every day the beauty of your merciful love so that we will not fall into spiritual apathy but always seek what is pleasing to you.
