Wisdom 12:19

You taught your people through your deeds that those who are just must be kind, and you gave your children good grounds for hope by giving them the possibility of repenting for their sins.

Hebrews 11:11

It was by faith that Sarah, in spite of being past the age, was given the possibility to conceive, because she believed that he who had made the promise was trustworthy.
