



Dearest Sisters,

In the community of Alba, at 10:45 a.m., our sister fell peacefully asleep in the Lord, after having run a long race for the Gospel:

GALLIAZZO GIUSEPPINA Sr. REDENTA
born in Santa Cristina (Treviso) on February 8, 1931.

Sr. Redenta grew up in a large, deeply Christian family. She entered the congregation in Rome on December 8, 1949, bringing with her the richness of her personality, the vitality that animated her, and a deep desire to give herself completely to the Lord in the service of the Gospel

She spent her years of initial formation and novitiate in the busy community of Rome. Sr. Redenta professed her first vows in the crypt of the Regina Apostolorum Basilica on March 19, 1953. These were years of great expansion for the congregation, and in Rome there was a spirit of enthusiasm for a mission that was steadily becoming more established. Just days earlier the Church had definitively approved the Institute, and Maestra Thecla's invitation to rejoice surely inspired her: *"With the certainty that comes from the Church's official recognition, we can say: 'We are in the will of God; the path we walk is the one that leads us to the summit of holiness'"*. Likewise, the Founder's call to advance toward broader horizons in every aspect of Pauline life must have left a lasting impression on her. With great zeal and diligence, she dedicated herself to spreading the Word of God in families, parishes, and communities in the populous dioceses of Rome and Naples. She later returned to Rome where she professed her perpetual vows on March 19, 1958.

After a time spent in the book center in Cagliari, Sr. Redenta accepted the service of superior in 1964 in the community of Benevento and later in Ancona and Cicogna. It was in this house, located in a small village in the hills of Valdarno, that Sr. Redenta revealed her innovative spirit and artistic gifts, inherited from her family. With creativity and determination, she quickly transformed what had been a family residence—donated by a benefactor—into a true center of spirituality: a welcoming place where the sisters could renew their strength in contact with nature and in a more intimate relationship with the Divine Master. In that house, Sr. Redenta discovered herself as a designer, gardener, and administrator. In that house, she gave her whole heart.

In 1973, at the conclusion of her term, she worked in the administrative offices of the Generalate and later served in the communities of Grosseto, Livorno, and Sassari. For more than thirty years, Sr. Redenta devoted herself with passion to managing the major book centers in Udine, Palermo, and Brescia, with particular attention to the audiovisual sector. She loved music and took joy in promoting meaningful productions for liturgical, biblical, educational, and recreational use. She was always open to relationships, ready for dialogue and conversation.


In 2008 Sr. Redenta was assigned to the San Giuseppe community in Alba to assist in the bindery. In community she was a wise and trusted presence. She was faithful to her daily walk on the hill of Santa Rosalia engaging in a friendly conversation with those she met, sowing words of comfort everywhere.

Due to a severe form of diabetes, Sr. Redenta had been in the Motherhouse infirmary in Alba for a few years where she gradually entrusted her care into the hands of the sisters and nurses. For the past month she was completely bedridden, and it seemed she was simply awaiting the coming of the Bridegroom.

Having almost reached the eve of the 12th General Chapter, let us entrust to this dear sister our prayer that God's dream for our congregation may be realized: *driven by the fire of the Spirit, let us invent new ways of good to communicate the Gospel of hope to all.*
